Promise To Protect



In response to the crisis of the sexual abuse of children by clergy in the Catholic Church, a comprehensive plan to address allegations of sexual abuse of minors or vulnerable adults by Catholic clergy, religious or other Archdiocesan employees has been adopted by the Archdiocese of Anchorage and includes;

- Creating a safe environment for children, young people and vulnerable adults
- Healing and reconciliation for victims and survivors
- Prompt and effective response to allegations of abuse
- Disciplining of offenders
- Cooperation with civil authorities

A vulnerable adult is anyone age 18 or older who has a physical or mental impairment or condition that prevents them from protecting themselves or from seeking help.

What Is Sexual Assault?

- Any sexual contact between an adult and a minor is considered sexual assault.
- Sexual assault is any sexual contact gained through force, threats, trickery, manipulation, or coercion.

What Is Sexual Harassment?

- Sexual harassment includes but is not limited to: Verbal assaults such as whistles, jokes, comments or insults; Visual assaults such as exposing oneself to another or exposing someone else to nude or pornographic material against their wishes or to a minor.
- Everyone has the right to say “No” at any time!

How Do I Get Help?

- The first step is to contact the Office of Children’s Services or Adult Protective Services. They will assist you in contacting your local law enforcement agency or you can contact the police directly.
- Contact the Archdiocesan Victim’s Assistance Coordinator or STAR as soon as possible. They will advocate for your rights and your well being, and assist you in finding appropriate medical, psychological and spiritual care as well as assisting with reports to the police. The Victim’s Assistance Coordinator will also notify the appropriate authorities within the Archdiocese.
- The Archdiocese of Anchorage is committed to cooperating fully with civil authorities in matters of sexual assault and takes each allegation seriously.
